Darlington Young Bulls FC is committed to providing a caring, friendly and safe environment for all our members so they can participate in football in a relaxed and secure atmosphere. Bullying of any kind is unacceptable at our club. We are a TELLING club: this means that anyone who knows that bullying is happening is expected to tell the Club Welfare Officer or any committee member. This club is committed to playing its part to teach players to treat each other with respect.

## What is Bullying?

Bullying is the use of aggression with the intention of hurting another person. Bullying results in pain and distress to the victim. Bullying can be:

- $\circledast$  Physical pushing, kicking, hitting, punching or any use of violence
- ${\mathfrak S}$  Sexual unwanted physical contact or sexually abusive comments
- 🟵 Verbal name-calling, sarcasm, spreading rumours, teasing

#### **Our Commitment**

### **Objectives of this Policy**

All club members coaches, officials and parents:

- $\circledast$  should understand what bullying is.
- ${\mathfrak S}$  should know what the club policy is on bullying, and follow it when bullying is reported.

#### **Signs and Indicators**

Adults should investigate if a child:

- $\circledast$  says he or she is being bullied
- $\circledast$  is unwilling to go to club sessions
- ${\mathfrak S}$  becomes withdrawn anxious, or lacking in confidence
- $\circledast$  feels ill before training sessions
- $\mathfrak{B}$  comes home with clothes torn or training equipment damaged
- $\circledast$  has possessions go "missing"
- $\mathfrak{B}$  asks for money or starts stealing money (to pay the bully)
- $\circledast$  has unexplained cuts or bruises
- ${}^{igodol{\otimes}}$  is frightened to say what's wrong
- $\circledast$  gives improbable excuses for any of the above.
